- Vidan Damljanovic received his diploma as a physiotherapist in 1981 in Belgrade, Serbia, and his diploma as a Shiatsu therapist in 2007 at the Kaiko Institute in Zurich, Switzerland and has been working and teaching in this field until today. From 1983 to 1988 he worked at the Belgrade Polyclinic and from 1988 to 1995 as a physiotherapist at the Heiden Cantonal Hospital, Switzerland. Since 1995 and until today he has been running his own physiotherapy practice in Au, Switzerland.

He has continuously attended various advanced training courses on manual therapy and MTT (medical training therapy) in Europe and Japan: Maitland, Cyriax, Mc Kenzie, Brian Mulligan's Manual Therapy, Proprioceptive Neuromuscular Facilitation (PNF), Osteopathy and Seiki. Following this trail, he had a strong focus on Seiki, focusing on the Shiatsu - physiotherapy. He uses Seiki in his daily practice and teaches this topic in various workshops across Europe; accompanied by regular training in Shiatsu and especially in Seiki with Akinobu Kishi Sensei and Kyoko Kishi Sensei. Vidan has been leading Seiki seminars since 2013. He has also been teaching and training kendo for more than 34 years and has headed the Bushikan Kendo Club, Au, Switzerland, since 1999 and has participated in several European and World Championships.

Oliver Föhnle studied at Heidelberg University, Germany, and received his PhD from the Technical University of Delft, The Netherlands, in "Optics Fabrication and Testing (OFT)" in 1998. He has been working in this field ever since, running projects within both environments: university and industry. From 1993 until 1999 he was employed by TNO (Institute for Applied Scientific Research, Delft, The Netherlands) and since 1999 (and up until now) he has been working at FISBA AG, St. Gallen, Switzerland, as "Senior Expert Optical Fabrication Technology" carrying out applied research projects focusing on product and fabrication process developments.

Besides that, he has been chairman of several scientific conferences in Europe and the US and since 2002 he has been visiting lecturer to the TU Delft and has been lecturing OFT seminars at Universities in Germany and Switzerland. He is chairman of the Industrial Advisory Board of the European Optical Society, published more than 95 scientific papers and has been teaching and training kendo for more than 26 years.
